## Is your OHS Licence expiring?

Do you currently hold an OHS licence to operate forklifts, cranes, boilers and hoists or perform scaffolding or rigging work?



OHS Licences previously granted had no expiry and were for life, however due to the adoption of national standards, a five year expiry is now in place along with a requirement to have a photograph on licences.

OHS Licences issued before 1 January 2005 have now expired. OHS Licences issued between 1 January 2005 and 30 June 2010 are still valid but will expire on 30 June 2015.

Valid OHS Licences can be upgraded to a High Risk Work Licence by filling out an application form and sending it to the Territory Business Centre. If your licence has expired, you will need to redo training and have your competency assessed by a High Risk Licensing Assessor before you can be reissued a licence.
