16.2 NEW FUNDING AND GRANT CO CONTRIBUTION

Can Crusher for Mataranka Regional Recycling Centre

The grant provides \$30,000 (GST Excl) for the purchase of a can crusher to be used at the Mataranka Regional Recycling Centre. Council is requested to approve the co-contribution of \$24,395 (GST Excl) in its budget.

Ngukurr Smimming Pool

The grant provides \$173,853 (GST Excl) for repairs and upgrades to the Ngukurr Swimming Pool. BACKGROUND

Mataranka Library, Museum and Tourist Information Centre

The Northern Territory Government has provided funding \$100,000 (GST Exclusive) for refurbishments and upgrades to the Mataranka Library, Museum and Tourist Information Centre.

NDIS Information, Linkages, and Capacity Building

The Commonwealth Government has provided funding of \$200,000 (GST Exclusive) to deliver the Activity for one year. The Activity Plan will be drafted following execution of the Funding Agreement. It is anticipated that the grant will fund the employment of a Level 6 Coordinator to project manage the Activity to completion, inclusive of travel to Communities for consultation with Council staff and People with Disability and their family members.

Commonwealth Home Support Program

The Commonwealth Government has provided funding of \$396,016 (GST Exclusive) over FY2018-FY2020 (2 years). The CHSP provides entry-level home support for frail older people who need assistance to keep living independently.

Community Child Care Fund

The Commonwealth Government has provided funding of \$5,064,753 (GST Exclusive) over FY2018-FY2022 (5 years). The Fund supports Council's child care services in Manyalluluk, Jilkminggan, and Beswick.

Budget preparation for 2018-19 financial years is in progress and a draft budget is presented in a separate report. The auditors were on site from week of 24th May for Interim Audit. Second budget revision for 2017-18 financial year is completed and a separate report is presented. The FBT return has been completed and lodged with ATO.



BACKGROUND

Roper Gulf Regional Council Community Services department has been successful in its application for funding under the Community Child Care Fund (CCCF) Restricted non-competitive grant opportunity.

The purpose of the CCCF is to support child care services to address barriers to child care participation, particularly targeting disadvantaged and vulnerable families and communities. Grants provided under the CCCF are intended to supplement income from the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) and additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) as well as fee income received from families. Together the estimated subsidy income that was provided in our application, and the allocated CCCF funding grant means that the service (s) will be better off under the new child care package than what was provided under the current Budget Based Funding (BBF) Program.

In the allocation of CCCF funding, priority has been given to sustainability funding to support services to transition. This funding includes operational, sustainability community support and other activities. Given this focus, funding sought from new activities has not been approved at this stage.

CCCF Guidelines allow for other capital projects and other activities to be supported in the future CCCF funding rounds.

Under the package our service and the families that use them will for the first time, be able to access the same direct support from the Australian Government as other approved child care services.

- 1. CCS / ACCS Estimated income from families in to the value of \$53,896.
- 2. CCCF Sustainability funding \$955,694 per year

The current BBF funding agreement ends on the 30th of June 2018.

The new CCCF funding agreement will be issued in May 2018 and this contract finishes in 2023.(five years). The mult year funding agreement will support Council to consider the longer term planning and provides greater security of funding.

Under the CCCF Guidelines the Department has discretion to provide additional sustainability funding where services experience financial difficulties because lower than expected subsidy income. In the first year, 50% of grant funding will be provided on execution of the funding agreement and there will be a review point following the first quarter to identify whether services achieve subsidy estimates.

In May 2018 the Department of Price Waterhouse Coopers will host forums across Australia. These forums will focus on the operational details and the next steps Council and family need to take in order to successfully transition to the package on the 2 of July 2018.

Council's main interest in this area are the secondary Highways of Central Arnhem Road, Roper and Carpentaria Highways. Council may also be interested in the development of mining infrastructure in the region.

Proposed Submission content

- change the name of the region to Big Rivers Region globally across the NTG Operations
- lack of industrial land and land release in general particularly in Borroloola and Mataranka. More challenging is a review of Ngukurr's Area Plan which identifies a small area for industrial land release. There are no surveyed lots and the location is unfeasible due to the availability of gravel required to fill the site which is adjacent to a deep drainage line.
- Increase the number of fatigue stops Council has identified through the Borroloola Local Authority to install at least two rest stops on the Woolagorang Road from Borroloola to the Queensland border for the self drive tourist industry on the Savannah Way. Providing waste receptacles and toilets as tourists are leaving considerable waste at outstation turnoffs and other sensitive areas on Country.
- Cost of freight is crippling household budgets in remote regional towns
- need for network improvements Councils would like to extend its thanks to the development of the Roper and Wilton River bridges and aims to advocate for the

continuation of bridge development on the Numbulwar Road rivers particularly the Phelps River which keeps Numbulwar residents behind water for all of the wet season.

- Key freight routes don't include barge services to remote Coastal communities
- Central Arnhem Road is a significant freight route for East Arnhem and should be included considering the funds proposed to upgrade this infrastructure asset.
- What is the future of the Roper to Bing Bong Port Haul Road and should it be included in the maps and information.

Support frail older people or prematurely aged people (50 years and over or 45 years and older for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people) who are on a low income and who are homeless or at risk of homelessness through linking to appropriate and sustainable housing, community care and other support services.
- 3. Support frail older people through the delivery of planned respite activities which allow carers to take a break from their usual caring responsibilities.
- 4. Support the development of the home support aged care service system that meets the aims of the Commonwealth Home Support Programme and broader aged care systems.

Grant starts on the 1st of July 2018 and ends on the 30th of June 2020. Total funding received \$395,020.58.

Commonwealth Home Support Program assists frail older people who are living in the community to maximize their independence. Through the delivery of timely, high quality entry- level support services which takes into account each person's individual goals, preferences and choices — and underpinned by a strong emphasis on restorative approaches, including wellness and enablement. This program helps its participants to stay living in their own homes for as long as they can and wish to do so by building relationships with the participants and their carers. This model of care is supported by Roper Gulf Regional Council Goals. And strategies.
