### BACKGROUND

As per the *Local Government Act 2019* and its statutory instruments, the council is to submit a current financial report of actual expenditure against the latest approved budget for the Local Authority area.

### ISSUES/OPTIONS/SWOT

There are variances in a few activities as outlined in the attached expenditure report. The brief explanation for these differences in budget and actual cost for each division is as follows:

#### Operating Income:

Operating Income of \$3,773,547 was received YTD for Ngukurr against a budget of \$4,795,061 resulting in a variance of \$1,021,514. The variance largely as a result of timing of grant and contract revenue.

#### Operating Expenditure:

Total Operating Expenditure YTD of \$3,773,547 against a budget of \$4,795,061 the resulting total variance in operating expenditure of \$1,021,514. The variance is largely due to timing of expenses, changes in allocation methodology for internal cost allocations, and vacancies in staff.

#### Capital Expenditure:


There has been \$402,168 capital expenditure YTD against a budget of \$2,444,167 resulting in a variance of \$2,041,999. The variance is caused by the timing variance of the budget being spread evenly; however a significant number of projects are scheduled to be completed in the last quarter of the financial year.
